MOAA AWARD OF MERIT MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES



Our RAC-MOAA Chapter supports JROTC programs at 24 local high schools. Through its Award of Merit Program, RAC-MOAA representatives present Medals and Certificates to one rising senior in each JROTC program. Candidates receiving the award are selected by their Senior Instructor based on seven criteria, including the demonstration of exceptional potential for military leadership, and holding a cadet officer billet or Senior NCO position for their senior year.

RAC-MOAA also solicits applications from 24 local JROTC high schools, on a competitive basis, for the COL Mel Drisko \$1,000 Leader-Scholar Award. Among other rigorous criteria, scholarship candidates must have been accepted into a Senior ROTC program at a four-year collegiate institution or

service academy. Successful candidates receive their award at RAC-MOAA's May dinner meeting. On 18 April 2023, Chapter members Navy Captain Hardy Josephson and LCDR Wayne Sine presented the MOAA medal and certificate to Cadet Lindsey Gholson, incoming Commanding Officer in the Navy JROTC program at Patrick Henry High School.

SENIOR ROTC AWARDS FOR OUTSTANDING THIRD YEAR CADETS

On 20 April 2023 RAC-MOAA presented MOAA Award of Merit Certificates and Medals to one outstanding Junior Cadet at each of the six colleges in the ROTC Battalion at the University of Richmond (U of R). LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

MOAA National held its Advocacy In Action event in Washington, D.C. on 25 and 26 April 2023. Due to COVID pandemic restrictions in the past, this was the first national, in-person, advocacy event in several years. MOAA Chapter representatives from across the U.S. attended advocacy training by MOAA national staff on 25 April 2023, then met with their congressional members at the U.S. Capital on 26 April 2023. This year's program focused on two primary goals:

- Restoring Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) to 100%. As a result of skyrocketing housing rentals, the goal was to relieve stress on our military and help reverse challenges to recruitment and retention.
- Reversing TRICARE Pharmacy Cuts. In late 2022, the Tricare network announced the loss of 14,000 pharmacies across the U.S. Despite efforts to reduce this number, many beneficiaries including the elderly and those with serious, chronic conditions have been denied proper access to prescriptions.

On 12 April 2023, several RAC-MOAA members participated, virtually and/or in person, in a Virginia Council of Chapters (VCOC) meeting held at the General George C. Marshall home in Leesburg, VA. The keynote speaker for the meeting was MOAA's Vice President of Government Affair, COL Dan Merry. COL Merry discussed this year's Advocacy in Action program, including background discussions which led to the two primary goals enumerated above.

ANOTHER OPTION FOR FUN THIS SUMMER AT COLONIAL DOWNS

If you're looking for a new way to unwind, 2023 may be the year to acquaint yourself with the workings of the fast-paced sport of horse racing. **Colonial Downs** has a new energy, thanks to bigger purses for bettors and the addition of three prestigious thoroughbred races to its calendar. The 2023 race season will be the New Kent County facility's first under new owners Churchill Downs Inc., also the owners of the Kentucky Derby. The sale was finalized in November 2022 as part of a \$2.75 million purchase that also included six Rosie's Gaming Emporium locations.

Live horse racing returns to Colonial Downs for the 2023 season every Thursday – Saturday from July 13 – September 9. Post time is 1:30PM EDT. Colonial Downs has plenty of options to suit everyone. General admission, which allows access to ground level outdoor trackside viewing, is free. There are plenty of reserved seating options as well, both outdoors and indoors. Outdoor grandstand seats and viewing boxes, under cover, are available for purchase. Indoor seats, in air-conditioned dining areas, are also available. Choose from a reserved table or lounge seats in the third floor Jockey Club, or a reserved table one level higher in the fourth floor's 1609 dining room. Private Sky Suites, each with a balcony overlooking the track, are available as well. Seats for all levels can be purchased at colonialdowns.com.

Patrons must be 21yrs of age to enter the Rosie's Gaming Emporium. For questions, call 804 -557-5684. Races are open to all ages! Parking and General Admission are free and families are welcome. General admission allows access to ground level outdoor track and paddock-side viewing. Outdoor grandstand seats and viewing boxes, under cover, are available for purchase at \$5/seat. Outdoor concessions are available.

DETAILS ON NEW VIRGINIA RETIREE EXEMPTIONS

Virginia military retirees 55 years and older will be able to keep more of their retirement income thanks to language in the state budget passed last year by the state's General Assembly.

Gov. Glenn Youngkin on June 21, 2022 signed the two-year budget, which exempts the first \$10,000 in military retirement income in the 2022 tax year. This number will jump to \$20,000 in 2023, \$30,000 in 2024, and \$40,000 in 2025 and beyond. The new law also applies to surviving spouses of military retirees.

That's an estimated \$575 in tax relief per \$10,000 of exemptions, according to MOAA Virginia Council of Chapters State Legislative Affairs Chair Col. Monti Zimmerman, USA (Ret).
